

02 - Why an MSC? Why Now?

	Funding Options for the Township	Funding Options for the MSC	
External Grant Funding	Not enough to cover required capital project	Bring available funds to the MSC to help fund the capital project	 Benefit #1: Financial Flexibility Can combine grant funds, development charge revenues, and financing to pay for capital project
Development Charges	Lack of upfront revenue for capital project		
Financing	Constraints due to municipal borrowing limit	Leverage both private capital and investment grade debt to finance the balance of the capital stack	
Benefit #2: Overcome Financial Restrictions Bring in gap financing that does not consolidate to the municipalities balance sheet (removes municipal borrowing limitations, increasing overall borrowing capacity)			

03 - Benefits of the Proposed MSC



Flexibility in Financing

Ability to combine grant funds, development charge revenues, and financing to pay for capital project



Overcome Financial Restrictions

Secure additional financing without impacting the municipality's balance sheet (removes municipal borrowing limitations, increasing overall borrowing capacity)



Skills Based Board

Ability to include private sector expertise while retaining full public ownership and control (financial, design, operations etc.)



Sustainability

'Utilities pay for utilities' model ensures transparent accounting and management, giving ratepayers clarity and setting the Township up for long-term success


